The essay should be 500 words or less, 12 pt font and double spaced on white paper.</p>

Finalists will be required to interview with the Rotary Club of Prince Frederick Scholarship Committee. Relatives of members of the Rotary Club of Prince Frederick will not be eligible to apply. Separate essay required in addition to the 2012 Calvert LSA Student Essay/Personal Statement.</p> <p style="text-align: center;"><b>College of Southern Maryland – Prince Frederick Scholarship</b> – Eligible applicant must be in good academic standing at a Calvert High School, and have been accepted to a program of study at the Prince Frederick CSM campus.</p>
